## **CHS Dual Credit Agreement**

We are pleased to offer students the opportunity to take dual credit college courses at Comanche High School. Please carefully read the following information and sign at the bottom.

Comanche ISD will pay half the tuition for dual credit classes. If a student's full tuition is covered by other sources (such as scholarships), Comanche ISD will not be responsible for paying a portion of the student's tuition.

- Comanche High School cannot guarantee that the college courses you are taking will transfer to the college you will be attending. Please contact the college of your choice with questions.
- Students must pass the course with a semester grade of 70 or above on the high school report card in order to receive high school credit for the course.
- Any college course taken during the summer or outside of the school day will not count as dual credit, be figured into GPA, or receive any tuition paid by the district.
- For some dual credit courses, six weeks grades are considered progress report grades and will not be used to calculate the semester average. Please check with your course instructor to determine how the semester average will be calculated. Note: For seniors, final senior class rankings will be configured on the last day of the fifth six weeks grading period prior to graduation; the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> six weeks college grades will be averaged for class ranking purposes.

## Repayment of Tuition—Please read carefully!

- If a student does not achieve a Ranger College grade of 70 or above, the student is responsible for repaying the tuition to CISD. (Tuition must be repaid to CISD if a D or below is earned in the college course.)
- If a student drops the course at any time, the tuition paid on behalf of the student must be repaid to CISD. The tuition must be repaid even if the student does not receive a refund from Ranger College. Whether or not the student receives a refund from the college depends on the date the course is dropped. The drop dates are set by Ranger College.
- If a student does not achieve a Ranger College grade of 70 or above or drops the course and does not repay the tuition to CISD, the student will be added to the fines list. All fines MUST be cleared up prior to the student graduating. If the student wishes to enroll in additional dual credit courses, repayment of tuition to CHS must occur prior to enrollment.
